In a stunning glaciated valley in County Wicklow, in the sixth century, one of Ireland's most revered saints founded a monastery. The foundation of St Kevin at Glendalough became one of the most famous religious centres in Europe.



The remains of this ‘Monastic City’, which are dotted across the glen, include a superb round tower, numerous medieval stone churches and some decorated crosses. Of particular note is St Kevin’s Bed, a small man-made cave in the cliff face above the Upper Lake. It is said that St Kevin lived and prayed there, but it may actually be a prehistoric burial place that far predates him.

Learn all about this hallowed place in the fine interpretive centre before exploring the site for yourself. If you do, you will be rewarded with spectacular views of the two lakes and a uniquely spiritual atmosphere. In a stunning glaciated valley in County Wicklow, in the sixth century, one of Ireland’s most revered saints founded a monastery. The foundation of St Kevin at Glendalough became one of the most famous religious centres in Europe.

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The Visitor Centre is fully accessible for visitors with disabilities. Access to the graveyard is very difficult for wheelchair users.

Toilets close at 16:15 from mid October to Mid March.

### The Rock of Cashel

Rock of Cashel

Rock of Cashel, St. Patrick's Rock of Cashel, Cashel E25 KX44, Ireland



Set on a dramatic outcrop of limestone in the Golden Vale, the Rock of Cashel, iconic in its historic significance, possesses the most impressive cluster of medieval buildings in Ireland. Among the monuments to be found there is a round tower, a high cross, a Romanesque chapel, a Gothic cathedral, an abbey, the Hall of the Vicars Choral and a fifteenth-century Tower House.

Originally the seat of the kings of Munster, according to legend St. Patrick himself came here to convert King Aenghus to Christianity. Brian Boru was crowned High King at Cashel in 978 and made it his capital.

In 1101 the site was granted to the church and Cashel swiftly rose to prominence as one of the most significant centres of ecclesiastical power in the country.

The surviving buildings are remarkable. Cormac's Chapel, for example, contains the only surviving Romanesque frescoes in Ireland.

The Rock of Cashel is one of Ireland's most spectacular and – deservedly – most visited tourist attractions.

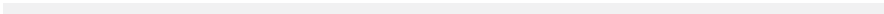

You are invited to step back in time on Molly's traditional farm, enjoy the animals while soaking in the history.

Molly's farm is typical of a small holding of land, rented from the local landlord. Large families were expected to eke out a living from a few acres of often poor land. Molly would have set up to an acre of potatoes to feed her family. She would have also reared pigs, cows, hens and chickens along with a donkey for doing the work around the farm.

The Farm has changed little since Molly's time and is a reminder of harsh times endured by our ancestors.

Ring of Kerry Ireland



Rolling green hills and sparkling lakes. Sheep bleating and cows grazing in patchwork fields. Pristine golden strands giving way to jaw-dropping cliffs. This treasure trove in the southwest coast of Ireland really has it all, which is why people come from far and wide to see the Ring of Kerry.

This scene-stealing route around the Iveragh Peninsula, beginning and ending in Killarney, takes in all the big hitters – Moll's Gap, Torc Waterfall and the Gap of Dunloe are winners – but really, the route itself is so much more than the sum of its parts. Within this 179km of road, you'll find that each turn brings a new treat to the eye, from lakes, rivers and waterfalls, to grand houses and castles. If you're feeling adventurous, the Ring of Kerry cycling route is one of Ireland's most famous, and there is really nothing like breathing in the fresh Kerry air as you drink up the incredible views around you.

This part of County Kerry is known for its pristine stretches of white, sandy beaches. Derrynane, Rossbeigh and St Finian's Bay are some of the most stunning, each strand a beautiful border between the glinting ocean and mountains of the Iveragh Peninsula.

There's a story behind the stunning "Ladies View" at the Lakes of Killarney – when Queen Victoria visited the Ring of Kerry in 1861, this spot was a favourite of her ladies-in-waiting. And the grandeur doesn't stop at the scenery: sleeping on the edges of the world-famous lakes sits Muckross House & Gardens. This 19th century mansion, along with its lush gardens, became Ireland's first National Park in 1932. Inside is luxury on another level, and upstairs you can even enter the perfectly preserved room that housed Queen Victoria during her famous stay!

Torc Waterfall is approximately 7 kilometres from Killarney Town and approx 2.5 kilometres from the motor entrance to Muckross House and is signposted from a carpark off the N71. A short walk of approx 200 metres brings you to the waterfall. From that point steps lead to another viewing point at a higher altitude that provides a view over the Middle Lake. The path is also part of the Kerry Way long distance walking route and a starting point for circular walking routes which are indicated by a map down at the start of the trail beside the car park. The waterfall which is approximately 20 metres high is at its best after heavy rainfall. Across the road from the car park jaunting cars can be hired for a trip to Muckross House within the National Park.

Kissane Sheep Farm is a Large Mountain Sheep Farm, with many hundreds of Sheep and Baby Lambs and has been owned by the Family for almost 200 years.

The Farm is situated on the N71 Road, between Kenmare & Killarney National Park in County Kerry in the Republic of Ireland. The famous panorama of Moll's Gap is in the middle of the land, overlooking and the farm and its sheep and lambs.

We are in a Special Area of Conservation and their main aim is to preserve the Farm and its sheep and baby lambs.

To help the Farm survive, they have opened the Farm to visitors since May of 2005 and every-day they welcome many Group Tours and Individuals & Families to come and visit the Farm and see their Sheep Dog Demonstrations & during the summer to also see the Sheep Shearing Demonstration.

In the Spring time the visitors will have the opportunity to see the many baby lambs that will be born on the Farm.

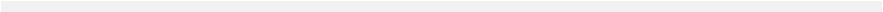


Slea Head Drive, one of Ireland's most scenic routes, takes you on a journey through historic sites, Irish speaking villages, famous Hollywood film locations with close up views of the world renowned Blasket Islands and distant views of the Skellig Islands on the south western horizon. The Slea Head Drive (Slí Cheann Sléibhe) is a circular route, forming part of the Wild Atlantic Way, beginning and ending in Dingle, that takes in a large number of attractions and stunning views on the western end of the Dingle Peninsula. The route is clearly labelled by road signs throughout its length. The Slea Head Route is most enjoyable when done slowly over a number of hours or days allowing time for the many interesting stops and detours along the way. A minimum of a half-day should be set aside for the journey. Travellers are strongly advised



to travel clockwise in order to avoid meeting the large tour buses that frequent the route during the summer. Part of the Sleah Head cliff road is very narrow and single lane only. The route is suitable for motorists, but is also enjoyed by cyclists - bicycles can be hired at a number of locations in Dingle.

Walk the safe, paved pathways and view the famous Cliffs on Europe's western frontier and enjoy the spectacular vistas over the Atlantic Ocean and the Aran Islands. Their natural beauty has inspired artists, musicians, and poets for generations, as well as absorbing scientists and geologists, drawn by the unique landscape in which they sit. The Cliffs of Moher, the most famous cliffs in Ireland, will leave you awestruck, creating memories that will stay with you forever.

The Visitor Centre, itself sculpted from the landscape, hosts informative and entertaining permanent exhibits in its extensive gallery space and auditorium.

Visit the on-site theatre and experience an exhilarating virtual-reality cliff-face adventure.

The Cliffs of Moher has featured in classic movies like *The Princess Bride* and *Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince*.

The Cliffs of Moher was a 'tourist attraction' before that phrase was even heard of. In the early 19th century, the then landowner, Cornelius O'Brien, parliamentarian, and proud Clare man, built O'Brien's Tower so that the expansive cliff views across the Atlantic Ocean from Liscannor Bay to Galway Bay could be fully appreciated. This paved the way for today's centre to be the top visitor attraction in Ireland and on the Wild Atlantic Way.

It is now part of the Burren and Cliffs of Moher UNESCO Global Geopark supporting sustainable tourism and has been a special protected area for birds and wildlife since 1979, home to 35 different species of birds. Cliffs of Moher Visitor Experience is a proud member of the Burren Ecotourism Network. See for yourself what has drawn people for over two centuries, it will stir your senses and fill your soul.

Admission includes access to all areas, secure car parking, wi-fi, access to the interactive Cliffs exhibition and water refill stations. In addition, there are two cafes, a craft & gift store and a craft and retail street on the left as you walk out of visitor centre, toilets, first aid centre, information points, baggage storage, free app and audio guide. Binoculars and picnic blankets available on request and "lifts of Moher" mobility vehicle. Admission price contributes to conservation of the area.

Travel by car and take a leisurely 1-hour drive along the Wild Atlantic Way to their ferry terminal in Rossaveel.

Ferries to the Aran Islands depart from Rossaveel port in Connemara, 37 kilometres west of Galway City centre. Parking is available at the pier at a cost of €7 for 24 hours.

The Aran Islands offer visitors a glimpse into a way of life that has long since disappeared from most of the world. Filled with traditional Irish culture, the islands offer breath-taking scenery, ecclesiastical ruins and world-renowned stone forts.

These three rocky limestone outcrops are a bastion of traditional language, culture, music and history on the edge of Europe. Regular music sessions, lively dances, traditional crafts, sea-going currachs and the wonderfully warm and welcoming Atlantic spirit, are inimitable parts of Aran.

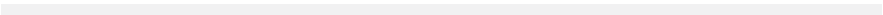
