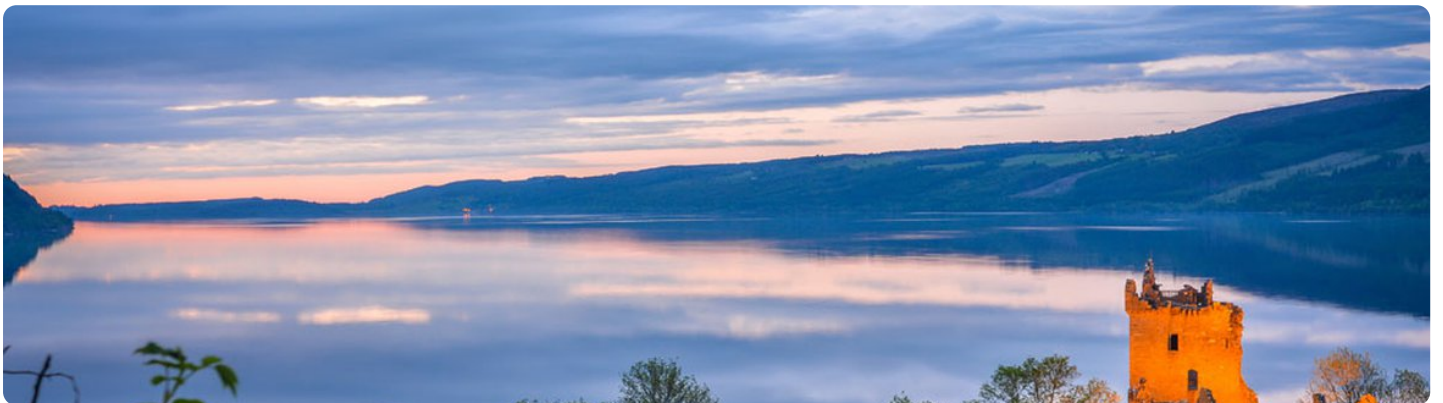

CULLODEN BATTLEFIELD AND VISITOR CENTRE, Inverness IV2 5EU, United Kingdom



Step onto one of the most powerful and moving sites in Scottish history. Culloden Battlefield marks the location of the final Jacobite Rising in 1746, a short but decisive battle that forever changed the Highlands. Begin your visit at the award-winning Visitor Centre, where a 360-degree immersive battle theatre places you right in the middle of the action. Explore the story of the 1745 Rising from both the Jacobite and Government sides through carefully curated displays of weapons, artefacts, and personal accounts that bring the history to life.

Outside, walk the windswept battlefield itself, visit the restored 18th-century Leanach Cottage, and take in panoramic views across the moor. Keep an eye out for Highland cows grazing nearby, a peaceful contrast to the events that once unfolded here. The visit also includes the chilling proclamation issued by the Duke of Cumberland in May 1746, outlining the harsh consequences faced by the defeated Jacobites.

Good to know before you go:

- The Battle of Culloden lasted less than an hour, yet its impact on Highland culture and clan life was enormous.
- It was the last pitched battle fought on British soil.
- The battlefield remains largely unchanged, making it one of the most authentic historic landscapes in Scotland.
- Clan stones mark where different Highland clans fought, and many visitors seek out their ancestral names.

Sobering, fascinating, and deeply atmospheric, Culloden is a place that leaves a lasting impression and offers a deeper understanding of Scotland's history and identity.

Discover the true story of the 1745 Rising, from both the Jacobite and Government perspectives, in our accredited museum, where weapons and unique artefacts are displayed.

Enjoy panoramic views from the roof garden, see the restored 18th-century Leanach Cottage and spot Highland cows grazing on the battlefield.

Read the proclamation issued by the Duke of Cumberland in May 1746, describing what would happen to the defeated Jacobites. There is much to see and do at this wonderful historic treasure!

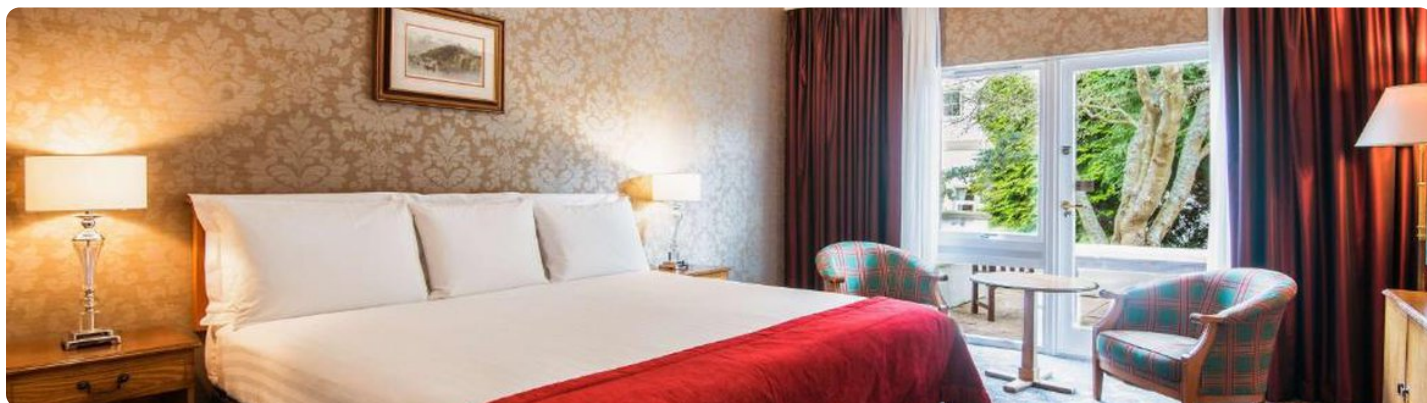

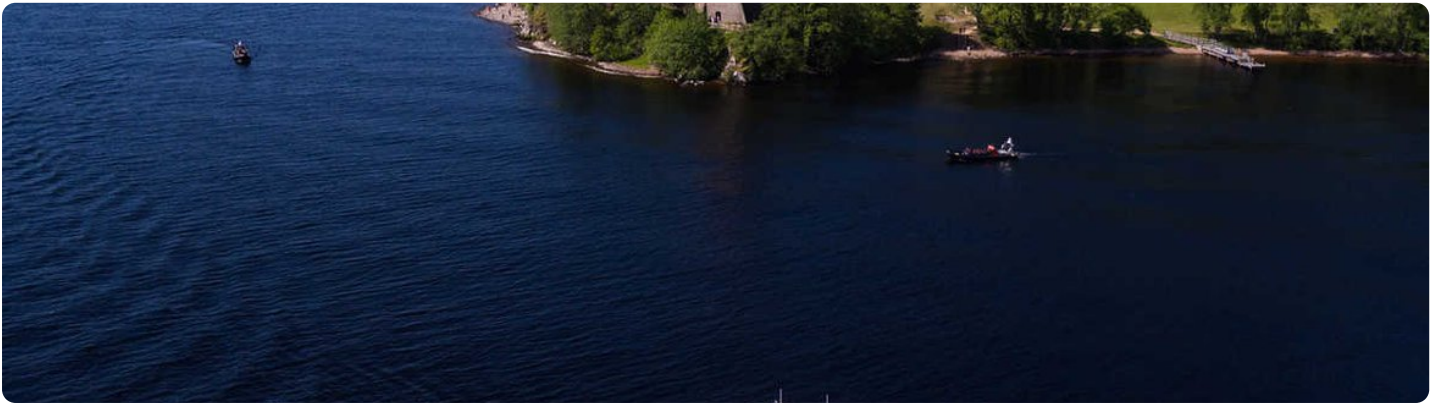

Cruise Loch Ness, Fort Augustus PH32 4BD, United Kingdom



All aboard for a classic Highland experience on Loch Ness. Based in the lively village of **Fort Augustus**, Cruise Loch Ness has been exploring these legendary waters since 1968 and has welcomed well over 1.5 million passengers along the way. That’s a lot of hopeful eyes scanning the water.

Your cruise glides across Scotland’s most famous loch, surrounded by steep hills and ever-changing skies, with plenty of time to take in the scenery and keep a playful lookout for Nessie. The company’s experienced crew know these waters inside out, having travelled the equivalent of several times around the world right here on the loch.

Fort Augustus itself sits at the southwest end of Loch Ness, where the Caledonian Canal meets the loch. It’s a popular stop for walkers, cyclists, and canal boats, and one of the prettiest places to begin a cruise.

Good to know before you go:

- Loch Ness holds more water than all the lakes in England and Wales combined, so Nessie has plenty of hiding places.
- Cruise Loch Ness boats are equipped with modern sonar, just in case the legend decides to make an appearance.
- The Caledonian Canal runs for 60 miles from Inverness to Fort William and passes straight through Fort Augustus via a series of impressive locks.
- Over the years, the loch has welcomed celebrities, explorers, and dedicated Nessie hunters, all hoping for a sighting.

Relaxing, scenic, and just mysterious enough, a Cruise Loch Ness experience is one of those moments where Highland legend and landscape come together perfectly.

Eilean Donan Castle, Dornie IV40 8DX, United Kingdom



Set where three sea lochs meet, **Eilean Donan Castle** looks like it was designed specifically to steal the spotlight. Originally built in the early 13th century, this iconic stronghold has become Scotland's most photographed castle and once you see it in person, it's easy to understand why.

Connected to the mainland by a graceful stone bridge and surrounded by ever-changing reflections, this is one of those places where every angle feels postcard worthy. Inside, you'll find stories of clan rivalries,

Jacobite drama, and centuries of Highland history brought to life.

Good to know before you go:

- Eilean Donan regularly tops lists as the most photographed castle in Scotland, and possibly one of the most photographed in the world.
- The castle was destroyed in 1719 during a Jacobite uprising and lay in ruins for nearly 200 years before being lovingly restored in the 20th century.
- It has starred in films and TV shows including *Highlander*, *James Bond: The World Is Not Enough*, and *Elizabeth: The Golden Age*.
- Its name comes from Saint Donnán, a Celtic saint said to have lived on the island in the 7th century.
- Weather here changes fast, which means dramatic skies, moody light, and photos that look straight out of a movie.

Equal parts history and Highland magic, Eilean Donan Castle is one of those stops that quietly becomes a trip favourite.

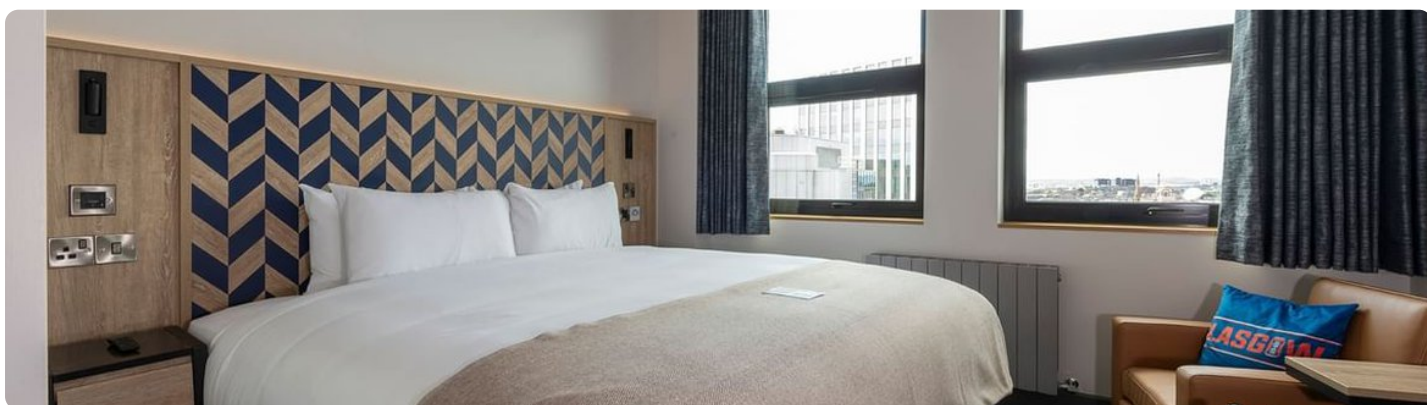

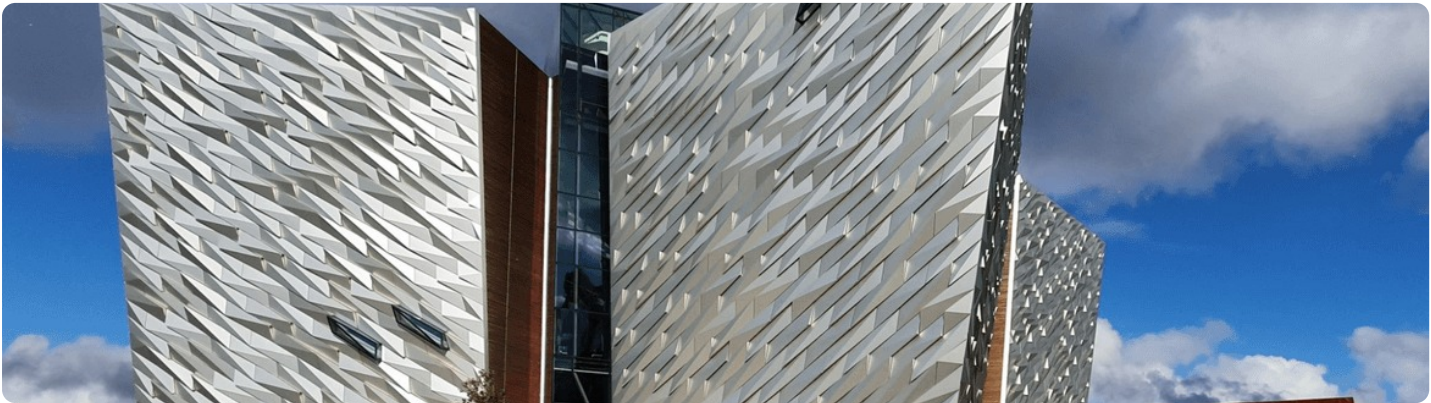

If you’re feeling adventurous, the Ring of Kerry cycling route is one of Ireland’s most famous, and there is really nothing like breathing in the fresh Kerry air as you drink up the incredible views around you.

This part of County Kerry is known for its pristine stretches of white, sandy beaches. Derrynane, Rossbeigh and St Finian’s Bay are some of the most stunning, each strand a beautiful border between the glinting ocean and mountains of the Iveragh Peninsula.

There’s a story behind the stunning "Ladies View" at the Lakes of Killarney – when Queen Victoria visited the Ring of Kerry in 1861, this spot was a favourite of her ladies-in-waiting. The route is clearly labelled by road signs throughout its length. The Slea Head Route is most enjoyable when done slowly over a number of hours or days allowing time for the many interesting stops and detours along the way. A minimum of a half-day should be set aside for the journey. Travellers are strongly advised to travel clockwise in order to avoid meeting the large tour buses that frequent the route during the summer. Part of the Slea Head cliff road is very narrow and single lane only. The route is suitable for motorists, but is also enjoyed by cyclists - bicycles can be hired at a number of locations in Dingle.

It is now part of the Burren and Cliffs of Moher UNESCO Global Geopark supporting sustainable tourism and has been a special protected area for birds and wildlife since 1979, home to 35 different species of birds. Cliffs of Moher Visitor Experience is a proud member of the Burren Ecotourism Network. See for yourself what has drawn people for over two centuries, it will stir your senses and fill your soul.
