Edinburgh Castle, Castlehill, Edinburgh EH1 2NG, United Kingdom



Perched dramatically on top of Castle Rock, **Edinburgh Castle** has been keeping watch over the city for centuries. One of Europe's oldest fortified sites, it has played many roles over the years, from royal residence and military stronghold to prison and power base, and it has stories for days. Climb Castle Hill and follow in the footsteps of kings, queens, soldiers, and the occasional troublemaker from Scotland's past. Inside the castle walls, you will discover the Crown Jewels of Scotland, the legendary Stone of Destiny, and some of the best panoramic views over Edinburgh's Old Town and beyond.

Fun facts to know before you go:

- Castle Rock is the plug of an extinct volcano that last erupted around 350 million years ago. Talk about a solid foundation.
- The One O'Clock Gun has been fired almost every day since 1861 to help ships in the Firth of Forth set their clocks. Locals still jump when it goes off.

- Edinburgh Castle has been besieged more times than almost any other place in Britain, earning its reputation as one of the most attacked castles in the world.
- The Stone of Destiny was once stolen by Scottish students from Westminster Abbey and secretly returned to Scotland in 1950.
- On a clear day, the views from the battlements stretch all the way to the Firth of Forth.

Although parts of the castle are still in military use today, the rest is yours to explore. Now a world-famous landmark and UNESCO World Heritage Site, Edinburgh Castle is where history, drama, and unforgettable views come together.

Day 2: Edinburgh to Loch Lomond to Glencoe – Highlands Bound (Overnight Fort William)

Depart **Edinburgh** this morning and travel west toward the beautiful shores of **Loch Lomond**, enjoying a scenic introduction to Scotland’s famous landscapes. Continue onward into the Highlands, where the road leads through the dramatic mountain scenery of **Glencoe**—one of Scotland’s most breathtaking and atmospheric glens.

From here, pass through **Ballachulish**, surrounded by sea lochs and rugged peaks, before arriving into **Fort William**. This evening, enjoy a **group dinner**, then settle in for your **overnight stay in Fort William**.



Loch Lomond

Loch Lomond



Loch Lomond is Scotland’s largest freshwater loch and one of its most loved. With wooded shores, scattered little islands, and gentle hills rolling toward the Highlands, it’s the kind of place that instantly slows you down. Best of all, it’s an easy hop from Glasgow or Edinburgh but feels wonderfully “away from it all.”

Pretty villages dot the shoreline, and the area is perfect for easy walks, relaxed boat trips, and soaking up your first taste of Highland scenery without long driving days. Think classic Scotland, just turned down a notch in the best possible way.

Good to know before you go:

- Loch Lomond has over 30 islands, many of them uninhabited, giving it serious explore-at-your-own-pace energy.
- It’s the largest freshwater loch in Great Britain by surface area, but not the deepest. Scotland loves to keep things interesting.
- The loch famously inspired the song *The Bonnie Banks o’ Loch Lomond*, which locals still belt out with enthusiasm.
- Red squirrels, ospreys, and even the occasional otter call the area home, so keep an eye out along the shoreline.

Peaceful, scenic, and effortlessly charming, Loch Lomond offers a gentle, welcoming introduction to the Highlands and a moment to breathe before the mountains really start to rise.



Welcome to Glencoe, where the scenery is bold, dramatic, and just a little bit moody in the best possible way. Set within Lochaber Geopark in the Scottish Highlands, this legendary glen was shaped over millions of years by ancient volcanoes and slow-moving glaciers, creating those jaw-dropping mountains that rise straight from the valley floor.

The village of Glencoe sits peacefully between the shores of Loch Leven and the entrance to the glen, making it an ideal base for exploring the wider Lochaber region, often known as the Outdoor Capital of the UK.

Good to know before you go:

- Glencoe was formed by a massive ancient supervolcano that collapsed around 420 million years ago. Nature really committed to the drama here.
- It's one of the most photographed landscapes in Scotland and has featured in films such as *Skyfall*, *Harry Potter*, and *Braveheart*.
- The glen is famous not only for its beauty but also for its tragic past, including the Massacre of Glencoe in 1692, a story still deeply woven into local history.
- Red deer often outnumber people in the surrounding hills, so don't be surprised if wildlife steals the spotlight.

Wild, atmospheric, and unforgettable, Glencoe is a place where Scotland's landscapes and legends truly collide.



Welcome to **Ballachulish**, a small Highland village where the scenery feels vast, wild, and wonderfully

cinematic. Set at the meeting point of **Loch Leven** and **Loch Linnhe**, Ballachulish sits right on the gateway to some of Scotland's most dramatic landscapes—Glencoe is practically on the doorstep, and the views in every direction are the kind that make you go quiet for a second.

Historically, Ballachulish was known for its **slate quarrying**, and you can still feel that deep connection between the village and the landscape around it—rugged, resilient, and shaped by time. Today, it's a peaceful base with a classic West Highlands atmosphere: sea lochs, mountain silhouettes, and ever-changing skies.

Good to know before you go:

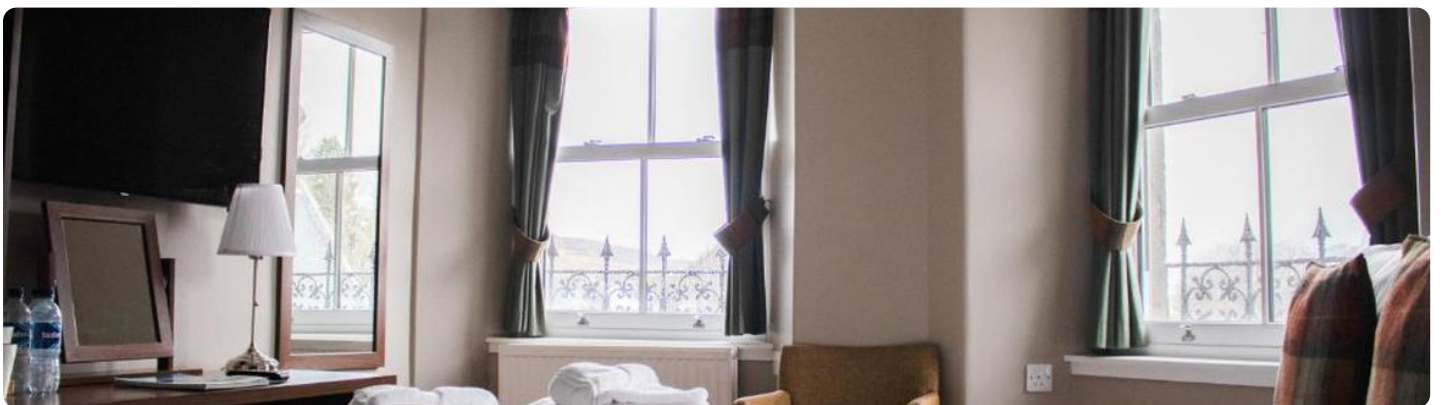

Eilean Donan Castle

Eilean Donan Castle, Dornie IV40 8DX, United Kingdom



Set where three sea lochs meet, **Eilean Donan Castle** looks like it was designed specifically to steal the spotlight. Originally built in the early 13th century, this iconic stronghold has become Scotland’s most photographed castle and once you see it in person, it’s easy to understand why. Connected to the mainland by a graceful stone bridge and surrounded by ever-changing reflections, this is one of those places where every angle feels postcard worthy. Inside, you’ll find stories of clan rivalries, Jacobite drama, and centuries of Highland history brought to life.

Good to know before you go:

- Eilean Donan regularly tops lists as the most photographed castle in Scotland, and possibly one of the most photographed in the world.
- The castle was destroyed in 1719 during a Jacobite uprising and lay in ruins for nearly 200 years before being lovingly restored in the 20th century.
- It has starred in films and TV shows including *Highlander*, *James Bond: The World Is Not Enough*, and *Elizabeth: The Golden Age*.
- Its name comes from Saint Donnán, a Celtic saint said to have lived on the island in the 7th century.
- Weather here changes fast, which means dramatic skies, moody light, and photos that look straight out of a movie.

Equal parts history and Highland magic, Eilean Donan Castle is one of those stops that quietly becomes a trip favourite.

Step onto one of the most powerful and moving sites in Scottish history. Culloden Battlefield marks the location of the final Jacobite Rising in 1746, a short but decisive battle that forever changed the Highlands. Begin your visit at the award-winning Visitor Centre, where a 360-degree immersive battle theatre places you right in the middle of the action. Explore the story of the 1745 Rising from both the Jacobite and Government sides through carefully curated displays of weapons, artefacts, and personal accounts that

bring the history to life.

Outside, walk the windswept battlefield itself, visit the restored 18th-century Leanach Cottage, and take in panoramic views across the moor. Keep an eye out for Highland cows grazing nearby, a peaceful contrast to the events that once unfolded here. The visit also includes the chilling proclamation issued by the Duke of Cumberland in May 1746, outlining the harsh consequences faced by the defeated Jacobites.

Good to know before you go:

- The Battle of Culloden lasted less than an hour, yet its impact on Highland culture and clan life was enormous.
- It was the last pitched battle fought on British soil.
- The battlefield remains largely unchanged, making it one of the most authentic historic landscapes in Scotland.
- Clan stones mark where different Highland clans fought, and many visitors seek out their ancestral names.

Sobering, fascinating, and deeply atmospheric, Culloden is a place that leaves a lasting impression and offers a deeper understanding of Scotland’s history and identity.

Discover the true story of the 1745 Rising, from both the Jacobite and Government perspectives, in our accredited museum, where weapons and unique artefacts are displayed.

Enjoy panoramic views from the roof garden, see the restored 18th-century Leanach Cottage and spot Highland cows grazing on the battlefield.

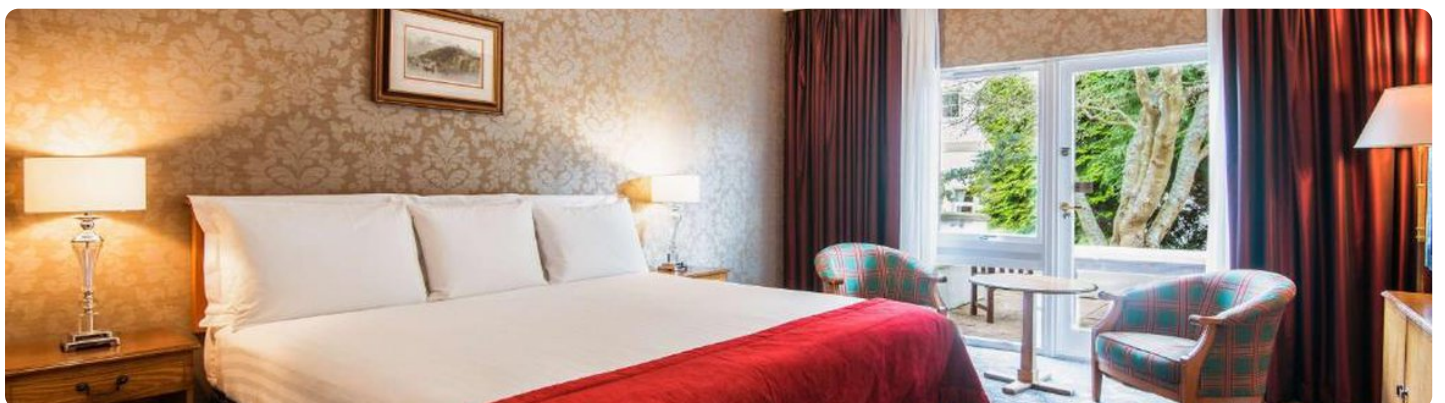

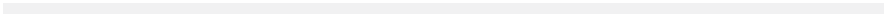

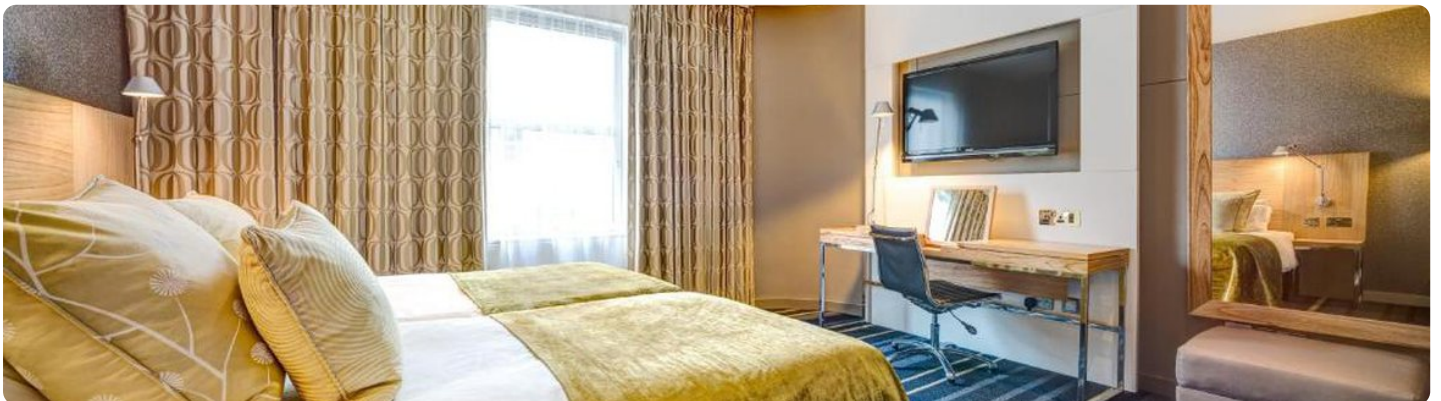
